### **Special cyber threats event in April**

The 30 April Gateway Operators Meeting will feature the Deloitte Cyber team to brief us on what they are seeing in the wider cyber environment regarding malicious activity, why scams are still working and what we need to be on the lookout for. ### **Initiatives prioritised**

Further to our letter to Gateway Operators dated 6 April, we have completed the work of re-prioritising GNGB initiatives for 2020 in response to COVID-19 and the increased industry activity around early access to super. We confirmed the 2020 dates for Gateway conformance activity have not changed however we have scaled back some non-essential activity. Key focus areas for the short term include improvements to the STN Information Security requirements already in progress, as well as supporting our Gateways through development and testing for Rollovers v3.0. Gateways are targeting finalisation of interoperability testing in October/November 2020 in anticipation of supporting their clients through implementation in 2021.

### **CPS234**

We note APRA's announcement this week of new commencement dates for the third party component of CPS234 on Information Security (on a case by case basis). GNGB remains able to support any questions in relation to the Information Security Framework across the STN. Your GNGB Gateway conformance letter outlines security focus areas for the STN and we are happy to talk to funds in more detail regarding the information security controls that exist today.
